Usually, the magazine is mailed from Chiefland, Florida, around the 21st of the month preceding the issue date.

The magazines are then sent to distribution centers based on the zip codes. When they arrive at the Post Office in your zip code area, they are separated according to carrier routes. Each carrier sorts all mail for his/her route into trays, which are about two feet long. Each carrier has a preestablished number of 'feet' of mail that they can deliver in one shift. If there is more mail than that on a given day, the excess waits for the next day and each day the first class mail takes precedence over second an third class bulk mail.

Some postal authorities tell us that 72 hours is the most it should take for all the magazines to be delivered. Other postal authorities tell us that it is up to the individual postman to decide when he wants to make the delivery. Again, judging by reports we get, this seems to be the case. We are told by subscribers within the state of service to you and your chapter. Florida and other areas close by, that the magazine has been received long

> Another postal issue that has been discussed regularly in this magazine is where to send your copy of the magazine. If you travel away from your home for extended periods of time, it is imperative that you notify our Membership Secretary as to where we should send your magazine. Times is mailed with a Standard Mail (Bulk Mail) permit. This is not the same as First Class. Standard Mail is not forwarded, regardless if you have a forwarding notice on file. Instead, each magazine not deliverable is returned to NSDCA in Middleton, WI at a cost to our organization.

Help us keep our rising postal costs to a minimum by notifying Roger Tipps of your address changes and when you'll be at that address.

> **Bran Muffins** Serves 6 to 8

1 cup Nabisco Bran 1 cup boiling water

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup oil 2 1/2 cups flour

3/4 tsp salt

2 1/2 tsp baking soda

2 eggs

2 cups buttermilk

2 cups Kelloggs All-Bran

8 oz raisins

Pour boiling water over Bran & cool. Cream sugar & oil. Sift flour, salt & baking soda. Mix eggs, buttermilk, Kelloggs All-Bran & raisins. Beat all ingredients with wooden spoon.

Crust:

2 cups flour

2 cups oatmeal (old-fashioned kind)

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 and a 1/2 cups brown sugar

1 and a 1/4 cups melted butter (best if butter, not margarine, is used)

1/2 cup chopped nuts (optional)

Mix above ingredients and press 1/2 of it into ungreased 9 x 13 pan. Bake 7 minutes at 350°.

Sprinkle one large bag of chocolate chips over crust. Drizzle one iar of caramel ice cream topping over chips. Crumble remainder of crust over all. Bake 15-20 minutes at 350 degrees until golden brown.

Simple Spinach

THE SQUARE & ROUND DANCE COMMUNITY LOST A DEAR FRIEND...

Robert (Doc/Bob) W. Tirrell, Jr.

Doc/Bob Tirrell, 85, went to be with his Lord Tuesday evening Dec. 29, 2009 peacefully with family at his side.

He was born June 27, 1924 in Brockton, MA to Robert Wilson Tirrell, Sr. and Edith Averill Tirrell. He attended several different schools in New England, Germany, and NJ. He



graduated with Dartmouth class of '45 although with the World War II interruption, it was actually in 1947. While at Dartmouth, he became a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon. During World War II, he was a Navy Pharmacist mate attached to the 3rd Marines, 3rd regiment in the Pacific. He furthered his education at New York University School of Dentistry, graduating in 1951.

Doc practiced dentistry in New York City for 20 years and then gradually moved his practice to New Jersey where he practiced for another 20 years. He retired in 1991 to Waterford, Vermont.

He married the love of his life, Peg Morse on June 16, 1948 in Ridgefield Park, NJ. They honeymooned while riding their bikes 13 days to get to their summer jobs in Lakewood, ME. They began square dancing for relaxation in 1949 at the local Y. This led them to a lifetime commitment to the promotion of square and round dancing. They began cueing and teaching round dancing in 1960. They helped form many square and round dance clubs including Tenakill Twirlers (Cresskill, NJ), Garden State Campers Chapter 001 NSDCA (NJ), MontShire Campin' Squares Chapter 181 NSDCA (VT/NH). They were presidents of the Northern New Jersey Square Dance Association in 1964-65 and editors of the association magazine, Grand Square, for 25 years. They were founding members of the Northern New Jersey Round Dance Leaders Council, becoming honorary lifetime members in 1992.

They were chairman of LEGACY (International Association of Square Dance Leaders) from 1981-1985 and 1997-1999 and Executive Secretary from 2000 -2003. They were Founders of ROUNDALAB, the International Association of Round Dance Leaders and served as Executive Secretary, and historian, as well as a member of many committees.

Upon retiring to Vermont, they became members of the Vermont Association of Round Dance Leaders (VARDL) and have served as secretary/treasurer. They have often represented VARDL at the Vermont Association of Western Style Square Dance Clubs (VAWSSDC) meetings. They have edited the VAWSSDC quarterly magazine, Gazette, for 14 years. They are lifetime members of the New England Square and Round Dance Foundation and have served as membership chairman and public relations chairman. They also were associate editors of the NSDCA TIMES, official magazine of the National Square Dance Campers Association (NSDCA), for 14 years and represent the NSDCA at ARTS-Dance meetings (Association of Square Dance Associations promoting square dancing).

They have choreographed many round dances and have taught and/or cued at 34 National Square Dance Conventions, 12 Canadian National Square

and Round Dance Conventions, and 21 New England Square and Round Dance Conventions. They were secretary and public relations chairman for the 2004 and 2005 New England Conventions in Brattleboro, VT. They have cued rounds for many square and round dance clubs in New Jersey, New York, Maine, Vermont, and New Hampshire, and called many square dance fun nights in New Jersey and New York.

They have received many awards for their dedication to the square and round dance activity including the Lucarini award (NJ -1965), Yankee Clipper (New England -2004), Roundalab Silver Circle (1992), Roundalab special award (2008), Silver Spur (national recognition of service to square dancing - 1995), and the LEGACY Heritage Award (national recognition of promotion of the square dance activity - 2002).

Square Dancing became a family activity and often they were joined on the dance floor by their three children and several grandchildren. In 1998 and 2008 they celebrated their 50th and 60th wedding anniversaries with special square and round dance parties. Doc was very proud to know the many people that he introduced to the joy of square and round dancing.

Since moving to Waterford, Doc had become involved with the Dartmouth '45 Tuesday monthly luncheon club, edited (with Peg) the Dartmouth '45 newsletter, and was co-chair of the 60th class reunion in 2005. As a member of North Congregational Church, he taught junior high Sunday school, served as a deacon, church treasurer, and acolyte coordinator. He also volunteered at the Wednesday community lunch program. Active in the lives of his grandchildren, he became a Boy Scout merit badge counselor. As a Friend of the Davies Memorial Library, Doc was in charge of the outdoor information sign.

Doc is survived by Peg Tirrell, his wife of 61+ years; his children, Scott (Deb) Tirrell of San Bernardino, CA, Barbara Connelly of Lower Waterford, and Gail (Christopher) Vaucher of Las Cruces, NM; his grandchildren, Jeff (Hollie) Tirrell of Beaverton, OR, Ryan (Cristina) Tirrell of Los Angeles, CA, Paul Connelly of Lower Waterford and Crystal Connelly of Lower Waterford.

He was predeceased by his brother Keith Tirrell, son-in-law Jim Connelly, and grandson Joshua Connelly.

A memorial service was held on Saturday, January 30, 2010 at 2 pm at North Congregational Church, 1325 Main St., St. Johnsbury, VT.

What is a National Square Dance Convention®?

The National Square Dance Convention® is an annual event occurring in late June each year moving from city to city based upon a bid process presented at the annual convention and awarded four years in the futures.

All members of the local convention committee are volunteers who donate their time, energy and expertise to produce the "World's Greatest Square Dance Event" each year.

The convention presents an extensive program of education through panels, seminars and workshops. But, the convention includes all phases of dancing, exhibitions, a fashion show, bid session, special events and much shopping opportunities at the Vendors. Most of all the convention provides fun and fellowship to dancers and leaders from around the world.

Many, many of the world's most able callers, cuers, and leaders include the National Square Dance Convention® in their busy schedules each year.

The convention is a one of a kind event that has been held annually for the past 56 years.

The World's Greatest Square Dance Event of 2010, the 59th National Square Dance Convention®, will be held at the expansive and beautiful Kentucky Expo Center in Louisville Kentucky. The Center, located less than a mile from the Louisville Interna-

tional Airport and at the junctions of I-65 and I-264, has 19,000 lighted parking spaces and on-site full hookup and dry camping. It is also surrounded by many hotels and restaurants.

What is a Trail End Dance?

Trail End dances are held the night before the official start of the Convention (Wednesday) and signifies that the travelers have reached the "end-of-the-trail" to the convention. There may be several Trail End dances conducted at the convention facility or local hotels, motels, or other dance facilities.

Dancing will begin with Trail-End Dances for all types of dancers and will be held on Wednesday following the Wednesday Night Special Show "Blair Carman and the Belleview Boys". There will be halls for Square Round Dancing, Contra Dancing. Clogging, Dancing. Dancing. Line Country Western and a Youth Hall. At least one hall each for Plus, Mainstream and A-2 will be running continuously during the Convention. The Youth Hall is only for dancers under 18 years old and gives young dancers a place where they can dance with other young dancers to the fast, highenergy music they enjoy.

A variety of workshops will be offered for all programs each day.

What is a Trail Thru Dance?

Dances held "on-the-trail" to the National Square Dance Convention ®. These dances may be sponsored by

any group and are not official conven- more camp sites available with hooktion dances. They celebrate the visitation of dancers passing through the area "on-the-way" to the National Square Dance Convention®.



FUTURE OF SQUARE DANCING by Jim Mayo

We, Modern Western Square Dance (MWSD) callers and dancers, are pretty much in agreement that our activity is not thriving. Certainly it does not come anywhere close to the popularity it once enjoyed. There are several possible explanations for this. Summarized, they are society has changed, MWSD has changed, or some combination. We all know that society has changed. People do not have the free time they once had and they are much less willing to commit to anything which requires regular attendance. If we are honest, we will admit that MWSD has become much more complicated than it was in the heyday of its popularity. So we can agree that the way square dancing is at present does not match the needs of today's society.

Those who love square dancing know it could be adapted to whatever society needs. At some level we also know that square dancing will have to change if it is to see a revival. This form of dance activity will need to be easier to enter. Those who are involved now are not much interested in trying some new form. We like it the way it is. We want clubs with a commitment to membership. We want people to go through a course that teaches at least the 70 calls we all know. We realize that folks can not just "walk in" and take part. They have to go through the training - and we like it that way.

What we have not been willing to acknowledge is that training is not only the class. We know, but don't really say, that after class the new dancer will still not be able to dance comfortably at most of the dances that will be available. The new dancer will have go for another year of dances at least, before they will be comfortable dancing with folks at an open dance - no matter what the advertised program.

If we made a "new" form of square dancing what could it be like? Where could it be started? Who would come? Would they be people we wanted as our friends? Most of "us" are older and were brought up in a different kind of world. It's not surprising that we do not recruit successfully in a new group of people. Perhaps we callers should try to find or create a different form of square dancing that would serve folks who are not just like us. If we did that, we should not expect today's dancers to recruit our new customers.

If we start with a blank page and redesign square dancing to serve today's people what could it be? I would suggest that it should be easier to learn and that it should not require people to show up at every session even while they are learning. It should provide an opportunity for folks to enjoy each other as well as the dancing. After all, that was one of the most important aspects of MWSD even though we never recognized how important it was until quite recently. A new type of square dancing should also continue to provide both physical and mental exercise. These aspects are both popular with our prospective new customer base. It would be good if we could find some organization to help us reach a new customer base. Ed Gilmore said

"Find some people and do what you have to do to get them

Where could we look for people? Churches are an obvious possibility. Much of what we have to offer is the kind of thing that churches stand for. We should not expect to recruit people away from the churches. We should offer a program that provides a social experience within the church. Another possibility is to look for support from community organizations such as service clubs, recreation departments, the YMCA or YWCA. They helped us get started 50 years ago. Or we could just use a community recreation facility and run it ourselves. I know of one such example that has been going and growing for a couple of years.

Why isn't this happening? I think it's because we don't want square dancing that is different from what we have created. We cling to the old model because this is what we know and feel comfortable with. Our caller schools still focus primarily on choreographic management and sight calling. They urge new callers to learn how to "provide variety." What that really means is keep it changing, never repeat a routine, and use all the calls looking for ways to use them differently. We seem committed to keeping square dancing complicated. Callers are not taught that they have to go out and find people and then give them a good time with whatever calls they can be taught easily. Most callers are committed to the belief that repetition is "boring". I would suggest instead that we call it "dancing".

One night parties are a good way to present square dancing to the public but they are seldom a source of regular work for callers. If they repeat, it's a couple of times a year, not the weekly or twice a month that we would like. They pay well and they could help us to introduce the idea that square dancing does not have to be difficult, but they are not an alternative for regular square dancing. To find that alternative we need brave callers to set out on a new course. Our CALLERLAB Winning Ways material describes some different approaches and I know a couple of these approaches that are surviving and thriving. I don't see many other callers or dancers that are interested in following those paths. Until we find some folks willing to break out from the old patterns, I doubt that we will see a rebirth of interest in the activity we have loved. If you are a caller having success with a different approach, I'd love to hear from you.

TechTips

By Bob Wilcox (050)

Battery Maintenance is an important issue. Let's take a minute and look at the very basics.

The battery should be cleaned using a baking soda and water solution; a couple of table spoons to a pint of water. Cable connections need to be cleaned and tightened as battery problems are often caused by dirty and loose connections.

A serviceable battery needs to have the fluid level maintained and periodically checked. If additional water is needed use only mineral free water, Distilled is best as all impurities have been removed, and there is nothing left that could contaminate your cells. Don't overfill battery cells especially in warmer weather because the natural fluid expansion in hot weather can push excess electrolytes from the battery. Most batteries are filled to the bottom of the filler hole.

To **prevent corrosion** of the cables on top post batteries remove the cable and place a felt battery washer at the base of the post. Coat the washer with high temperature grease or petroleum jelly (Vaseline), then place cable on the post and tighten. After tightening, coating the exposed cable end with the grease will help prevent more corrosion.
