From the ... KAMPERS' KITCHEN

Carolyn Dees of Strawberry Travelers, FL #153 shared this recipe from her mother-in-law.

Chocolate Chip Pound Cake

1 (18.25 oz.) box yellow cake mix w/ pudding

1/2 cup sugar

1 (3.9 oz.) box instant chocolate pudding

3/4 cup vegetable oil

4 large eggs

3/4 cup water

1 (8 oz.) carton sour cream

1 (6 oz.) pkg. semi-sweet morsels

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Sifted powdered sugar

Combine cake mix, sugar and pudding mix, stirring with a wire whisk to remove lumps. Add oil, eggs, water and sour cream, stirring until smooth. Stir in chocolate morsels and vanilla. Pour into a greased, floured Bundt pan or a 10-inch tube pan.

Bake in a 350° oven 1 hour or until wooden pick comes out clean. Cool in pan 15 minutes before removing. Let cool completely and sprinkle with sifted powdered sugar.

A few seasonal recipes from our growing collection of square dance favorites.

Great Pumpkin Dessert

1 can (15oz) solid pack pumpkin

3 eggs

4 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice

1 can (12 oz) evaporated milk 3/4 cup margarine (melted) 1 1/2 cups chopped walnuts

In a mixing bowl, combine the first 5 ingredients. (I use my hand mixer). Transfer to a greased 13 x 9 baking pan. Sprinkle with dry cake mix and drizzle with butter. Top with walnuts. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. Serve with ice cream or whipped cream. Yield: 12-16 servings.

PUMPKIN CHEESE BALL

1 pkg (8 oz) cream cheese softened 1 carton (8 oz) spreadable chive and onion cream cheese

2 cups (8 oz) shredded sharp cheddar cheese

2 teaspoons paprika 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper 1 celery rib or broccoli stalk

In a small bowl, beat cream cheeses until smooth. Stir in the cheddar cheese, paprika and cayenne. Shape into a ball. Wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate for 4 hours or until firm. With a knife add vertical lines to the cheese ball to resemble a pumpkin; insert celery rib or broccoli stalk for the stem. Serve with apple slices and/or crackers.



CAMPING

We will have our camping at Wayne County Fairgrounds and RV Park, 10871 Quirk., Belleville, MI.

The Web site i s www.waynecountyfairgrounds.net.

There are about 125 sites for hook up to water and electricity, and room for about 200 dry campers. There is also a small area set up for tent campers. There are 3 restrooms in the camping area with a shower and a dump station, all at no charge to the campers. We will be charging \$40.00 for hook-ups and \$25.00 per night for dry camping with a 4 day minimum on each.

The campgrounds are approximately 30 minutes from Cobo via I-94 to US-10. We will be bussing from the campgrounds to Cobo, but we do not have a cost of bussing at this time. We have use of some of the buildings at the campgrounds and will be having a Trail-End Dance on the campgrounds and we will also have a building set up as an office on the campgrounds.

Emergency calls are to 911, as the Police, Fire, and Ambulance is only one block away. We will be talking to the Police in the area and see if they will send a car through the area while we are there. We can set up



Check your Battery Disconnect Switches when your Motorhome won't start. A true story.

Getting ready to leave the campground after six weeks onsite I tried to raise the jacks and nothing worked. I called my husband to try and he had the same results. He checked the chassis battery charge on the monitor panel and nothing registered. Of course, he thought the battery was dead. He got his toolkit out and disconnected the battery and removed it to take to Wal-Mart in exchange for a new battery. While he was doing this a friend walked by and during our conversation she gave me the number of an RV mechanic that was recently downsized by a local dealer.

My husband loaded the battery into the car and away we went to Wal-Mart. Before buying a new battery he asked the mechanic to test the one we had. Of course it passed all the tests with flying colors. Back to the camper we went. My husband reinstalled the battery and tried to start the Motorhome. No luck. By now he thought it was the alternator. He extended the rear slide-out to get a screwdriver out of the tool drawer. Then he took the doghouse off to gain access to the engine and wiggled the wires on the alternator (He's that kind of mechanic). He tried to start the Motorhome and it started. Of course, he had to turn it off to put the slide-out back in. After putting the slide back in he tried to restart the engine. Again no luck.

While he was doing all this super mechanic stuff I called the RV mechanic. When I explained the symptoms to him he thought it was a disconnect switch. I put my husband on the phone and they tried the switch in the coach and it seemed to work as it should (it only worked on the coach batteries and not the chassis battery).

Did I mention that while all this was going on my husband called the Ford RV Hotline and they set up an appointment with a local Ford dealer to troubleshoot and fix the problem (\$\$\$\$). He also called Good Sam Road service and arranged for a tow to the Ford dealer.

After talking to the RV Mechanic he walked out of the Motorhome and remembered that there were two mechanical battery disconnects outside. He checked the one for the coach batteries and it was fine. When he moved his toolkit to check the disconnect for the chassis battery he found that it was in the off position! Apparently he had disconnected it while getting his toolkit out and putting it back several times during out campout. When he turned it to the ON position everything worked.

About that time Good Sam called to tell us when the tow truck would be there. He was able to cancel the tow truck. He then called the Ford dealer and cancelled the appointment. He explained that he caused the problem and how he fixed it. The service advisor is still smiling. Then I called the RV



New Year's Toss

The sewing area seems to be a place were our cleaning and organizing energy runs out. Is it because we get distracted by the possibilities found in our hobby? Or is it because we would just rather sew than clean any day? There seems to be something about sewing that causes over active saving. We save a six inch piece of lace, an old zipper, and an empty thread spool. All of these things take up space in our limited sewing area and they take up our time when we have to paw through them to find what we need. Set aside a time to clean and organize the sewing area. - Start with a big waste basket to toss things in.

Let's start small. Look at the bobbins. If there is only a little bit of thread on the bobbin wind it back on the spool or just toss it away. Thread may be taking up bobbin space that doesn't have a spool to match. Are two yards really worth saving? A bobbin only holds 35 to 40 yards and it usually takes 2 bobbins to complete a garment. Free up several bobbins so that they will be ready for the next new creation. Check for rust, rough spots or cracks. These can damage your machine. - Toss out any bad bobbins.

On to the thread spools. If there are any wooden spools they are over 40 years old. That thread is very fragile and will break under the normal stress of the sewing machine. If there is only one layer of thread on a spool there isn't enough for a mending job. Those spools are taking up space and getting in the way. Buy new strong thread when buying new fabric. - Toss out old thread.

Pins and needles don't last forever. Machine needles pass through the fabric thousands of times at high speeds. They get worn out. Sew a seam with a used needle and then put in a brand new needle and sew. Listen to the difference and look at the quality of the stitching. The needle passes cleanly through the fabric and the machine doesn't work as hard. Pins get old and damaged from repeated use, they will snag and ruin fabric. - Toss out old needles and pins.

Take <u>all</u> the scissors in to be sharpened, even the ones in the kitchen and the desk. Properly cared for your sewing scissors can last a long time. Always buy quality scissors. To check, hold them up by one finger bow, they should stay closed. If they fall open they are too loose. If the scissor sharpener can't tighten them, open the junk drawer. - Toss them in.

Purchase a couple of new seam rippers. Dull cutting edges require more force to open the seam. That pulls on the fabric and stretches the edges. Using more force can cause the ripper to slip and rip right through the fabric instead of the seam. - Toss out old seam rippers.

We turn pattern pieces around and scrunch them tightly together in order to 'save' the most fabric for our scrap bins. Those bins become very full and often don't have any pieces that are big enough for anything. This became very apparent to me when a neighbor asked me to make some clothes for a baby doll. Many scraps that I had so carefully hoarded weren't big enough to make baby doll clothes. - Weed out the bits and toss them.

If you just can't toss out all of those carefully saved scraps make a sewing box for a child. Get a small tool box and stock it with scissors, pins, needles, and thread (those almost empty spools). Add all of the odd buttons that are bouncing around in your sewing stuff. Gather pieces of lace, elastic and ribbon that are too short to be useful. Put the fabric, trim and elastic in a large bin with a secure top. Place the tool box on top of the bin and add a big ribbon. That makes a present that will spark her imagination and provide hours of creative joy.

For the final step of spring cleaning open up your fabric collection. It is not a stash because stash implies that we are hiding something and that is certainly not true. So dig under the bed, reach to the top closet shelves and pull the drawers all the way out. Place all of your fabric in a pile and look at each piece. What are your plans for this fabric? Do you have enough? Do you really like it.? If you don't enjoy the fabric you won't enjoy working on it. If you feel forced to work on it the sewing will not go well. Life is too short and sewing time is too limited to waste it on fabric that is wrong. Take all of those pieces of fabric that you no longer want and hold a fabric swap with your sewing friends

A good way to meet sewing friends is the American Sewing Guild. www.asg.org. This is a non-profit organization who's aim is to connect people who like to sew with each other. Sharing tips, ideas and fabric is a wonderful way to take what is usually a solitary hobby and make it a shared adventure. Group Sewing is the best form of Group Therapy.

Cleaning and organizing your sewing area will give your creativity a boost and enable your to find things faster and easier. Start the New Year with a new attitude and a new square dance dress.
