



Do you like to know what's going on in our square dance community?

Do you like to be involved?

NSDCA is accepting volunteers for openings for positions on the Board, Staff and Representatives.

We want you to be involved! If you enjoy camp-in and dancing and want to help the community of dancers, then you are qualified!

WHO SHOULD BE A NOMINEE FOR THE BOD?

A LEADER - One who proceeds to be foremost, to direct in movement toward the right direction. (Webster definition)

FAMILIAR - With general operation of NSDCA, have a background of active participation in Chapter affairs, Provincial or State Camporees, or an International Camporee and experience with social, civic, or business organizations.

REQUIREMENTS - Must be willing to serve FOUR YEARS and to attend National Board Meetings a the International Camporee and in the winter or any Special Meeting.

If you are interested, you will find complete job descriptions posted on the website NSDCA.org.

All necessary forms that need to filed are also available on the website, or you may contact any member of the Board for additional information.

The NSDCA Board of Directors recommends that the following Bylaw Amendment (Article XI, Section 4 paragraph a) be approved by the Membership at the Annual Meeting at the 55th International NSDCA Camporee in Amana, IA.

OLD WAY

Article XI - Chapters and Associations (OLD)

Section 4. a) To form a chapter there must be a minimum of 16 adult members.

b) The minimum to retain a chapter shall be determined by the Board of Directors. Section 5. Subject to these By-Laws, the Board of Directors of NSDCA is authorized and empowered to promulgate rules and regulations:

a) Governing the admission of chapters and state/provincial associations.

b) The suspension, cancellation, and termination of charters.

c) The Board may amend such rules and regulations, as it deems necessary.

NEW WAY

Arricle XI - Chapters and Associations (NEW)

Section 4, a) THE number of members needed to form a chapter shall be determined by the Board.

b) The minimum to retain a chapter shall be determined by the Board of Directors. Section 5. Subject to these By-Laws, the Board of Directors of NSDCA is authorized and empowered to promulgate rules and regulations:

a) Governing the admission of chapters and state provincial associations.

b) The suspension, cancellation, and termination of charters.

c) The Board may amend such rules and regulations, as it deems necessary.

Rationale for the proposed change:


In recent years there has been several opportunities for new NSDCA Chapters to be formed but were not accomplished because the exact number of people required was not reached in time to complete the process.

With the new wording, it allows a degree of flexibility to the BOD to study, on a case by case basis; whether to allow a Chapter to be formed and grow or hold off until a larger group is available.

Guiding principles, for future Board Members to use, may be placed in the NSDCA.
Policy or NSDCA Standing Rules.

The Bylaws would retain the intended concept but the "How to Do Instructions" details allow adjustments to new or changing conditions as the years roll by:

NSDCA BLANKET LIABILITY INSURANCE

NSDCA has had blanket liability insurance coverage of all its activities since August 1, 1975. We are currently buying insurance through the Lawley Vivacqua LLC Agency and are insured with the Atlantic Casualty Insurance Company

This insurance is issued in the name of the association, all its affiliated chapters, and includes all officers and directors, of either the association or any chapter while engaged in any activity on behalf of their group. The limit of the liability is \$1,000,000.00 per incident (\$2,000,000 aggregate) for either bodily injury or property damage or both when NSDCA is determined negligent.

This is however NOT accident insurance. It covers only injury or damage caused accidentally by negligence of NSDCA or its chapters in the course of any activity. It will not necessarily pay for any injury that might happen. It has to have happened in such a way that NSDCA would be legally held responsible for the injury. The insurance company would investigate and defend a claim resulting from any accident, but the injured party will normally not receive a settlement unless it can be proven there was negligence or fault of the chapter(s) or association.

The policy is issued on a comprehensive liability form that covers all the activities of NSDCA or its chapters. This includes campouts, meetings, social affairs or any other type of an event, all of which are automatically insured. Specific questions should be referred to the company agent through whom the insurance is written.

The Application Forms, for Insurance Certificates, are available from (NSDCA.org). There is no cost for a 'Proof of Insurance' Certificate and may be obtained by contacting Diana L. Scarupa, Account Manager for Lawley Vivacqua Scheff LLC located at 501 John James Audubon Parkway Suite 302

HOWEVER, if the entity (land or building owner, municipality etc.) requires their name to be explicitly listed as an ADDITIONAL insured, there is an additional charge for each entity added and is to be paid by the requesting Chapter. This request has to be made thru the NSDCA Board.



NSDCA, Inc. REGISTERED COMPOSITE MARKS




REVIEW OF THE USE OF NSDCA REGISTERED MARKS

The above marks are registered in the US Parent Office. The Association adopted the following recommendations made by our attorney at the time of registration:

- A. The NSDCA registrations are for composite marks, that is marks that encompass both words and a picture design, i.e. "National Square Dance Camper" and a log fire design; "NSD Camper" and a log fire design; both having the R in a circle. We have no protection on the use of the log fire design alone, i.e., separate and spart from the words and initials which form part of our marks.
- B. The present NSDCA registration offers protection of the sale of glass-ware, jewelry, clothes, etc. if sale of said items is limited to membership in NSDCA, Inc. In order to maintain and control the protection of the marks sale of such items and the general use of the NSDCA marks must be pre-approved by the Board of Directors.
- C. Upon the sale of campers, trailers, motor homes, sutomobiles, etc. carrying the NSDCA marks all such marks shall be removed before the sale is completed. Decals can be removed rather easily by gently applying heat from a hair dryer.
- D. Whenever the NSDCA marks are incorporated into a design including chapter banners, make sure to use the entire mark including the small R in the circle.

Jazz up your fituess routine with a regular dose of Dancing!
It's true. Whether you're swirling across the dance floor to a
Strauss Waltz or doing do-si-dos to the commands of a Square
Dance Caller, you're getting exercise - and probably having fun
too.

Dancing pairs you up with more than a partner. From burning calories to socializing with friends, dancing offers these health benefits:

Calories - Dancing can burn as many calories as walking, swimming or riding a bicycle. During a half hour of dancing you can burn between 200 and 400 calories. One factor that determines how many calories you'll expend is the distance you travel. In one study, researchers attached pedometers to Square Dancers and found that each person covered five miles in a single evening.

Cardinvascular Conditioning - Regular exercise can lead to a slower heart rate, lower blood pressure and improve cholesterol profile. Experts typically recommend 30 - 40 minutes of continuous activity three or four times a week. Dancing may not provide all the conditioning you need, but it can help. The degree of cardiovascular conditioning depends on how vigorously you dance, how long you dance continuously, and how regularly you do it.

Strong Bones - The side to side movements of many dances strengthens your weight bearing bones (tibia, fibula and feman) and can help prevent or slow loss of bone mass (osteoporosis). Rehabilitation - If you're recovering from heart or knee surgery, movement may be part of your rehabilitation. Dancing is a positive alternative to aerobic dancing or jogging. Sociability - Dancing contains a social component that solitary fitness endeavors don't. It gives you an opportunity to develop strong social ties which contribute to self-esteem and a positive outlook.

Tomorrow might when you consider settling for a little television, turn on the music instead. After a few spins around the living room, you'll have so much fun you may forget you're exercising.



Correct Waste System Evacuation Prodedures

According to RV maintenance experts, here's how to safely and completely evacuate RV holding tanks:

- Always wear disposable protective gloves when handling any waste system component and be sure to wash your hands thoroughly afterwards.
- 2. Connect the sewer hose. Begin by Inserting the nozzle end of the hose into the campground sewer inlet or dump site, and open the valve on the nozzle. Walk back towards the termination assembly on the coach extending the hose only the distance required. Always avoid snaking a full-length hose back and forth on the ground. If more hose is needed to reach the coach, simply attach an extension hose when necessary.
- 3. Only evacuate a holding tank (black or gray) when it is over 3/4 full. Yes, contrary to what some veteran Rivers may tell you, this means leaving the gray valve fully closed while in the campground. Filling each tank to a level above the 3/4 mark before evacuating will ensure you'll have enough volume (and velocity), to thoroughly drain the tank and flush the hose.

Here's another reason for keeping the gray holding tank valve completely closed except during evacuation. Ever walk through a beautifut, scenic campground and catch a whiff of sewer odor wafting through the park? Kinda ruins the moment, right? All coaches with the gray tank valve in the open position (sewer hoses obviously connected), are simply acting as a direct conduit to the park's sewer system. Each coach becomes a mini-vent of sorts, in parallel with the septic system of that campground. No wonder sewer odors still abound in the nicest of destination sites.

Evacuate the black tank first. This is pretty much standard procedure and something most all coach owners are aware of, but it's worthy to mention it again.

After the black tank empties flush it out with a large amount of fresh water when connected to city water. Simply keep flushing the toilet while the termination valve remains open.

- 5. Evacuate the gray tank last. After the black tank has completely emptied and its termination valve properly closed, open the gray tank valve and empty that holding tank. Be sure to rinse this tank as well. Dumping the gray tank last utilizes its liquid contents, as well as the fresh water induced after dumping, to help wash away any solid waste that may remain in the sewer hose.
- 6. Drain the sewer hose. After both tanks have been emptied for the last time at that location, take the time to thoroughly rinse the sewer hose with fresh water until clear water. After closing the gray termination valve, remove the sewer hose. Then begin "milking the hose." In other words, raise the hose at the coach end and walk it towards the sewer inlet. Keep raising the hose as you walk, thereby "milking" the hose and emptying it completely of water.
- 7. After milking the hose and as you reach the campground sewer inlet connection, close the positive shut-off valve on the sewer nozzle and disconnect it from the campground sewer inlet. Remember the first in last out rule! With the cap on the coach end and the nozzle valve turned off on the sewer end, all remaining odors stay inside the hose. Cap the sewer inlet and then stow the hose and add an enzyme-based additive to all holding tanks.

Following these correct and complete evacuation procedures will be appreciated by everyone:
