



#### 2016 "Fortnight of Fun" Preliminary Report

What a wonderful 2 weeks we had at the end of June until the 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend. The 59<sup>th</sup> National Square Dance Convention in Des Moines started off on Wednesday evening. Although Pat & I did not get to do any dancing, we still were busy and participated in duties that we had volunteered for and performed. In an effort to get the 2016 NSDCA International Camporee setup for Sunday noon "Check-In" we left Des Moines before the closing ceremonies so we do not know if the goal of 4000 dancers was reached but it seemed likely it would happen before we left.

Upon arrival at the Amana RV Park and Event Center by 10:00 AM we discovered that several of the campers had already come in a few days before the "Noon Sunday" early arrival start time. Among the first arrivals were some of the campers from the Alabama Chapter #152 that came not just to attend the Camporee but also to help us while they learned what needs be done by a Camporee Host group since it will be their turn next year. Their help was a God-send as by the "Noon Start Time" many of the Sunday 118 units parked started arriving. The final count for the Camporee ended up being 144 Units. Unfortunately, we had some health issues, break downs and family emergencies that resulted in some campers missing out on the fun time we had. They are lifted in prayer and refunds will be made to them.

The Special "Sunday" Night Dance with Tony Oxendine and Jerry Story ended up with 197 dancers. After deducting all the expenses for Callers, Food, Advertising and miscellaneous logistics costs we had \$106.68 to split between the NSDCA Camporee and ALL-IOWA Camporee host accounts.

This was an unusual year in that as a result of considering a request from many distant campers we changed the dates of the ALL-IOWA to follow the NSDCA International which followed the National Square Dance Convention. Since this saved many extra travel miles it produced a 282% increase in the NSDCA and a 310% increase in the ALL-IOWA Camporee attendances. Many thanks are due to all the participants. It has been many years since we have had 6 squares dancing at the ALL-IOWA. What a thrill for both callers/cuers and dancers as it made for a fun time party style Ice Cream Social. Although the expense of 26 gallons of Ice Cream and all the other supplies was a hit on our revenue overage it was indeed well received and appreciated by so many. We had help from several states and this looks like what will be needed in the future.

An E-Mail "Thank You & Survey" has been sent to the E-mail addresses that I knew of and many answers have been sent back already. The results will be E-mailed once the answers have been recorded and comments added. The future of our activity depends on how we meet the needs of our members so it is important that we not only receive the survey answers but actually hear what the members are telling us.

An additional thank you is extended to all the Iowa Helpers and those from Wisconsin, Illinois, Florida and Pennsylvania for all the work they did to make this a very enjoyable time for all. Many of the Non-members signed up as new members so we applaud that activity as well for a job well done by all as attendees and workers. So now it is forward to Maggie Valley, NC to see you all again.

Several of us traveled to Amana, Iowa, for the Nationals and the NSDCA International Camporee. We enjoyed visiting the Amana Colonies.



# 2016 NSDCA State & Province Camporees

#### USE OF NSDCA REGISTERED TRADEMARKS /LOGOS

The two trademarks or logos shown here are registered in the US Patent Office. The Association adopted the following recommendations made by our attorney at the time of registration:

A. The NSDCA registrations are for composite marks, that is marks that encompass both words and a picture design, i.e. "National Square Dance Camper" and a log fire design; "NSD Camper" and a log fire design; both having the R in a circle. We have no protection on the use of the log fire design alone, i.e., separate and apart from the words and initials which form part of our marks.





- B. The present NSDCA registration offers protection of the sale of glassware, jewelry, clothes, etc., if sale of said items is limited to members of the NSDCA, Inc. In order to maintain and control the protection of the marks sale of such items, the general use of the NSDCA marks must be pre-approved by the Board of Directors.
- C. Upon the sale of campers, trailers, motor homes, automobiles, etc. carrying the NSDCA marks all such marks shall be removed before the sale is completed. Decals can be removed easily by gently applying heat from a hair dryer.
- D. Whenever the NSDCA marks are incorporated into a design such as chapter banners, make sure to use the entire mark including the small R in the circle

#### NSDCA BLANKET LIABILITY INSURANCE

The NSDCA has had blanket liability insurance coverage for all its activities since August 1, 1975. We are currently buying insurance through the Lawley Vivacqua LLC Agency and are insured with the Atlantic Casualty Insurance Company.

This insurance is issued in the name of the association, all its affiliated chapters, and includes all officers and directors, of either the association or any chapter while it engages in any activity on behalf of their group. The limit of the liability is \$1,000,000.00 per incident (\$2,000,000 aggregate) for either bodily injury or property damage or both when NSDCA is determined negligent.

This is however **NOT** accident insurance. It covers only injury or damage caused by accidents or negligence of the NSDCA or its chapters in the course of their activity. It will not necessarily pay for any injury that might happen. It has to happen in such a way that NSDCA would be legally held responsible for the injury. The insurance company would investigate and defend a claim resulting from any accident, but the injured party will normally not receive a settlement unless it can be proven there was negligence or fault of the chapters or association.

The policy is issued on a comprehensive liability form that covers the activities of the NSDCA or its chapters. This includes campouts, meetings, social affairs or any other type of an event, all of which are automatically insured. Specific questions should be referred to the company agent through whom the insurance is written.

The application Forms for Insurance Certificates, are available from the NSDCA at www.nsdca.org. There is no charge for the 'Proof of Insurance' certificate and it may be obtained by contacting:

If the entity (land or building owner, municipality etc.) requires their name to be explicitly listed as an ADDITIONAL insured, there is an additional charge for each name to be added which is to be paid by the requesting chapter. The request must be made thru the NSDCA board.

#### How and What to Submit for the Chats Section

It would be wonderful if we received more input for the Chats Around the Campfire section. This is for you, our members to let other chapters know the fun things you're doing and tell them about the great times your having. You don't have to be a great writer, just simply willing to let others know what's going on. You can submit a list of activities or a write it up in a paragraph or two, it doesn't matter. A picture or two is also great and an easy way to communicate. Here are some guidelines that would make the editor's job much easier:

- 1. Send everything by e-mail.
- 2. Text fonts should be something simple like Arial or Times New Roman and font size 12 is preferred.
- 3. You can add text documents or Word files as attachments or include them in the body of the e-mail.
- 4. Photos or other graphics should be in either jpg or png format of 250 dpi or more, and can be color or gray scale. Remember that if you send color photos, they will be in gray scale when they're included in the Times.
- 5. Please tell us a little about the content of your photos; who's in it, what's going on, where and when did it take place.
- 6. Don't worry about cropping photos; we can take care of that.
- 7. Tell us who you are. We would like your name (first and last), chapter name & number and you're phone number with your submission in case we need to contact you.
- 8. For the Chapter Campouts section, it would be very helpful if your weekend begins with a dance on Friday night and ends with people leaving on Sunday, that you list all three dates (Friday, Saturday and Sunday) in your schedule so you don't give people the idea that everything is over on Saturday night. That way we wont have to list two sections for weekends, one for those who provide two dates, and another for those who provide three dates.
- 9. Make sure all your input reaches the editor before the deadlines of February 1, May 1, August 1 and November 1. We have very little time to get everything ready for the printer.
- 10. Most important, keep your Chats coming!
