



State & Area Representatives Reports

Thank you, Florida, for a fabulous Camporee.

A little over a year ago Dolly and I approached the FANSDC with the request to host the 2018 International Camporee, not in Florida, but in Sedalia, MO. After a short discussion, they agreed and quickly stepped up to fill the main Camporee Chair positions. We can't thank you enough.

Here it is a year later with all the plans completed and the Camporee now in the NSDCA history books. This was a very important event because Florida demonstrated that support local to the Camporee site and venue is not necessary. What is required is good communications and a willing and motivated team.

The Florida attitude is also evident in the FANSDC Camporee this year from October 25th thru 28th at Southern Palms in Eustis (see page 47) and the planned third annual Spring Fling to be held at the same site from April 19th thru 21st, 2019. Florida chapters have demonstrated time and time again that greater numbers at a campout simply means more fun. With that said, it's important to consider camping and dancing with other chapters. Not only that, wherever you plan your campout weekends, be sure to invite the resort residents or guests and any other non-camping chapters in the immediate area. Invite them and they will come.

At this time, there are still six chapters in the state, all doing well, but often getting only one or two squares on the floor. The combined 128/168 Chapters (Square Wheels and Gypsy Squares) continue to do much better than that because of the co-camping weekends. Chapter 018 deserves a lot of credit because Ted Hughes continues trying to rebuild the chapter, and often co-camps with other groups. The remaining Chapters, 082 Hitch-n-Go, 153 Strawberry Travelers and 193 RoadRunners, continue to camp and dance regularly.

Florida's biggest challenge next to finding new members is finding suitable venues for campout weekends. We love our winter visitors, but more and more come in RVs and stake out seasonal sites at many of the resorts we've relied on in the past. This makes it extremely difficult to find resorts to camp at from December through April. Since most of the Florida chapters go dark during June, July and August, our suggestion is to find a central location for a combined Florida Summer Camp to bring all those together who stay behind and endure the heat.

As a last item, we're looking for someone to take over from us as the Florida State Representatives to the NSDCA. If you think you'd like to try that, please let us know.

We Remember Our Friends

As we all get older, the certainty of an empty position in our squares becomes a recurring reality. We've shared good times, great dancing, wonderful food and hours of chats and laughter around flickering campfires. It's no surprise that we occasionally need to include some of those dear to us in this magazine.

NSDCA BLANKET LIABILITY INSURANCE

The NSDCA has had blanket liability insurance coverage for all its activities since August 1, 1975. We are currently buying insurance through the Lawley Vivacqua LLC Agency and are insured with the Atlantic Casualty Insurance Company.

This insurance is issued in the name of the association, all its affiliated chapters, and includes all officers and directors, of either the association or any chapter while it engages in any activity on behalf of their group. The limit of the liability is \$1,000,000.00 per incident (\$2,000,000 aggregate) for either bodily injury or property damage or both when NSDCA is negligent.

This is however **NOT** accident insurance. It covers only injury or damage caused accident or negligence of the NSDCA or its chapters in the course of their activity. It will not necessarily pay for any injury that might happen. It has to happen in such a way that NSDCA would be legally held responsible for the injury. The insurance company would investigate and defend a claim resulting from any accident, but the injured party will normally not receive a settlement unless it can be proven there was negligence or fault of the chapters or association.

The policy is issued on a comprehensive liability form that covers the activities of the NSDCA or its chapters. This includes campouts, meetings, social affairs or any other type of an event, all of which are automatically insured. Specific questions should be referred to the company agent through whom the insurance is written.

The application Forms for Insurance Certificates, are available from the NSDCA at www.nsdca.org. There is no charge for the 'Proof of Insurance' certificate and it may be obtained by contacting:

If the entity (land or building owner, municipality etc.) requires their name to be explicitly listed as an ADDITIONAL insured, there is an additional charge for each name to be added which is to be paid by the requesting chapter. The request must be made thru the NSDCA board.







Helpful Hints

Some Simple Suggestions to Make Camping Easier



Camping in Style

More years ago than I care to remember, my wife and I had a Volkswagen camper bus complete with the pop-top hinged at the back, a tiny ice box, a small sink with a gallon or so of water (always at ambient temperature), and a drop-down table for meals or playing cards. The camper had no bathroom facilities and we lacked heat and air conditioning (while we were driving or camping). There was one 110-volt electric duplex outlet and one dim 12-volt lamp. We liked to joke that we had to leave the VW just to change our mind.

Today I'm willing to believe that most of us travel with virtual palaces on wheels, whether it be a motorhome, trailer or 5th wheel, and the tow vehicle for the latter two are relatively comfortable. But sometimes we want something a little larger (or smaller) or wish to change RV styles.

What do you look at when thinking about a new RV? Here's an article that addresses some things to consider, copied from a user forum I belong to dealing with the manufacturing line of trailer we presently own.

Floor plan, floorplan, floorplan!

Look for how the floorplan will work for you. Then when you find something you like, look for "gotchas" in the floorplan.

Can you use the kitchen/toilet with the slides in?

Are there any pitfalls in the floorplan like doors that can catch on slideouts coming in, if the door isn't closed?

Are there aspects to the floorplan that "we can live with that" that will become bugbears after a while?

Then get on the internet and look, look, look. Take your time and really consider whether you've picked the right one. If you can, go back to the dealer or another dealer and go and walk through/sit in it for a while. We [the author of this article] spent nine months going through this. We didn't have the option of re-visiting the dealers and viewing the trailer, so I had to do it all over the internet. The Keystone website has 3D interactive viewers which are VERY useful for viewing floorplans.

Ingredients:

- 2 Tbsp. melted margarine
- 1/2 cup sugar
- ♦ 3 eggs
- 1 cup of either liquid non-dairy creamer, soymilk or cow 's milk
- 1 10 oz. pkg. frozen butternut squash, defrosted
- ◆ 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- ♦ 1/4 tsp. salt
- A dash of cinnamon
- A dash of nutmeg

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Grease shallow 2 qt. casserole dish.
- 2. Use an electric mixer, blender or a good whisk to mix the ingredients (less the cinnamon and nutmeg) until well blended.
- 3. Pour mixture into casserole dish.
- 4. Sprinkle cinnamon an nutmeg on top.
- 5. Bake uncovered 50-60 minutes or until a toothpick in the center comes out clean.

Cut into squares. Makes 8-10 servings.

Next, work out your towing weights and lengths. Be realistic about this. A 43' fifth wheeler gives you a LOT of room inside, but where ya gonna park it? A lot of the state parks we go to, we see some really big rigs in there, but I wouldn't want to be finding a site for a 43-footer, nor backing it in. As you go up in size, the purchase and maintenance costs go up, also the fuel consumption to move it from A to B. If you want to store it in the off season, where can you put it? A lot of 5ers are very tall and you might have difficulty finding covered storage for it. I would recommend that when you put it in storage, you have it under cover. The sun is a hard task master on roofs and that is a place of significant vulnerability for RVs and where you can incur big repair bills.

Finally, if this is to be your first rig, I would suggest doing what we did. We rented an RV (Class C in our case) and did some travel in it. When we stopped at parks, I talked to people who had TTs of a similar size to what I was thinking of. Without exception, they invited me to have a look inside their trailers. I found most people very friendly and proud of their rigs and eager to show them off, and talk about their strengths and weaknesses.

How and What to Submit for the Campout Schedule Section

By now, somewhere around 55 years down the road for the *Times*, everyone should be clear on what to submit for your chapter campouts and for the campout schedules sections. The discussion on the chats has been running all year so there should be no questions. However, the *Campout Schedules* section leaves me a little baffled. It almost seems like many of you are trying to keep your campouts a secret and are discouraging visitors. We consistently get listings for campouts without contact information for the chapter and for the Chapter Contact. When that happens, we use the *Chapter Contacts* listed on pages 58 through 62. That may not be the best contact for any particular campout.

Here's what should be included for your campout schedule listing:

- 1. Your chapter number, chapter name and state.
- 2. The specific location of your campout venue including the name, address, and phone number if you expect campers to make their own reservations with the resort or campground.
- 3. The dates of your campout including the arrival date and the departure date. If you camp/dance on Friday and Saturday, then everyone goes home on Sunday, be sure to include Sunday as the end date unless you expect everyone to hitch up and head home on Saturday night. In the future, if you send in Friday and Saturday dates, the Sunday date will be listed as your end date. Listing two days for some chapters and three for others for the same weekends is also a lot of extra work.
- 4. The name of your campout host, wagon master or other chapter contact complete with phone number and e-mail.
- 5. Any other special information such as special events like state conventions, local festivals that your attending, etc.

Some final thoughts. Don't address the information to your regular chapter members who should already have the information they need before reading the *Times*. The campout schedule should be addressed to potential guests or visitors; who knows, they may want to join your chapter. So simply giving the name of a campground and the state it's located in may be sufficient for your members, but it would probably discourage most visitors from trying to find you, it certainly would deter me. size limitation; it's much better for you to decide what you want to emphasize and have included in the *Times* rather than have me (who didn't experience what you and your chapter did) make any necessary cuts. Be sure photographs are high quality (i.e., a large number of pixels), and leave them in their native aspect-ratio format (i.e., let me do the cropping). If you so wish, feel free to produce your own photo -montage for submission. Recognize, however, that the overall size of the montage may be 'shrunk' rendering some fine detail difficult to see.

• Lastly, please notice the deadline for submitting your articles has been moved back one calendar day (see page 51). I will endeavor to acknowledge receipt of your article as it is received. I have been using email and other forms of electronic communication long enough to know that the system is far from perfect, so if I do not indicate I have received your article within a day or so of your sending it, please resend it (checking the address you are sending it to) and contact me via phone to let me know to be on the lookout for it.
