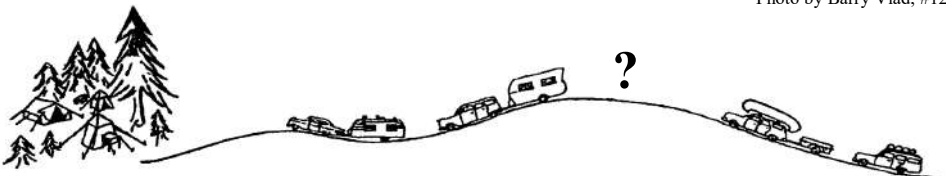

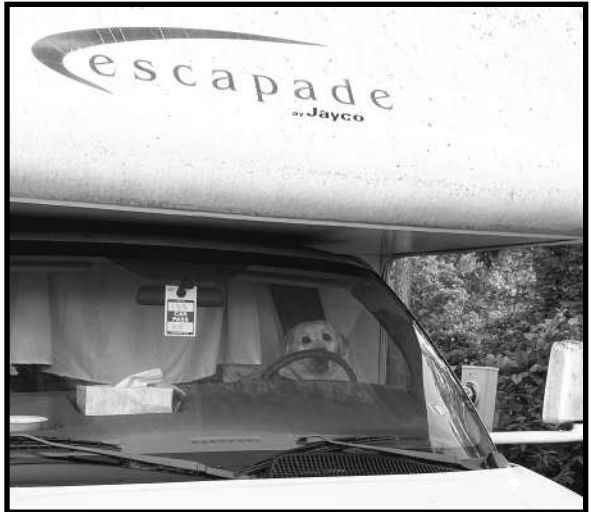

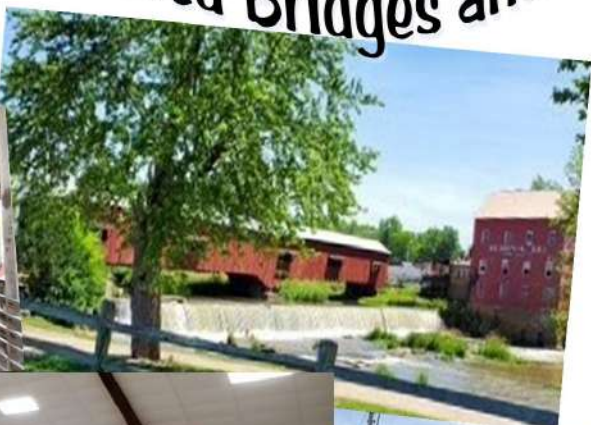

Raw Apple Cake

Ingredients:

- 3 C All-purpose flour
- 2 C Sugar
- 1 T Baking soda
- 1 tsp Salt
- 2 tsp Cinnamon
(or more, I usually use at least 1 Tbsp)
- 1C Canola oil
- 3 Eggs, beaten
- 3C Peeled and diced raw apples (Granny Smith, Honey
Crisps, Pink Lady or any combination are best)
- 1½C Chopped Walnuts
- 2 tsp Vanilla

Steps:

- 1) Mix together all dry ingredients in a large bowl
- 2) Make a well in the dry mix
- 3) Mix oil and eggs together, pour into well
- 4) Toss in apples, nuts and vanilla
- 5) Mix well to a cake dough consistency (will be very thick)
- 6) Preheat oven to 300°F
- 7) Grease 9" X 13" X 2" pan
- 8) Carefully spread dough into pan
- 9) Bake for one hour; Toothpick tester should come out clean.
- 10) Cool

Serve simply with sprinkled confectionary sugar, or do like I do, serve with cream cheese frosting. That recipe follows:

Cream Cheese Frosting

Ingredients:

- ½C Softened butter to room temperature
- 8 oz Regular cream cheese softened at room temperature
- 3-3½C Confectionery sugar
- 1 tsp Vanilla
- ¼ tsp Salt

Steps:

- 1) Using an electric mixer on medium speed, beat the cream cheese and butter together until smooth
- 2) Use a rubber spatula to scrape down sides of bowl to ensure an even mixture

later drop-down access.

This issue's cover photo was taken by Barry Vlad (#123, Swing-N-Travelers) at the International Camporee. I hope others submit photos as requested in last quarter's issue for consideration as a cover. Speaking of photos, when a picture is submitted for the "Chapter Chat" or any other purpose, please provide it as an attachment to your email; do not embed it into a word processing document (e.g., Microsoft Word). Also please be sure to provide the photo as it comes straight out of the camera or phone; do not compress or otherwise try to shrink the file size, as this compromises the image quality. I received numerous photos for this issue that were 50 kilobytes (50 KB) in size or smaller, which is fine if you want them displayed about the size of a postage stamp, but then you'd need a magnifying glass to see any detail! A photo's file size should be on the order of 300 KB (minimum) to about 5 MB (megabytes), either in JPG or PNG format; please do not send BMP or TIFF. Some phones ask if you want to reduce the file size if you email the photo directly from the phone; please answer "no" to these requests. Also be sure to provide some details as to where the photo was taken; and be sure to include your name (for photo credit) and note your NSDCA chapter. Remember, submissions must be made no later than the deadline for the desired issue to be considered for publication. But you don't have to wait until just before the issue deadline – send them in early and they'll be reviewed at the proper time.

Lastly, speaking of submissions, I only have a handful of recipes from just a few people. Another of the submitted recipes is provided in this issue (see page 37). I am certain that more than three people have recipes they would like to share – so please let us tantalize our tastebuds with your culinary cuisine! 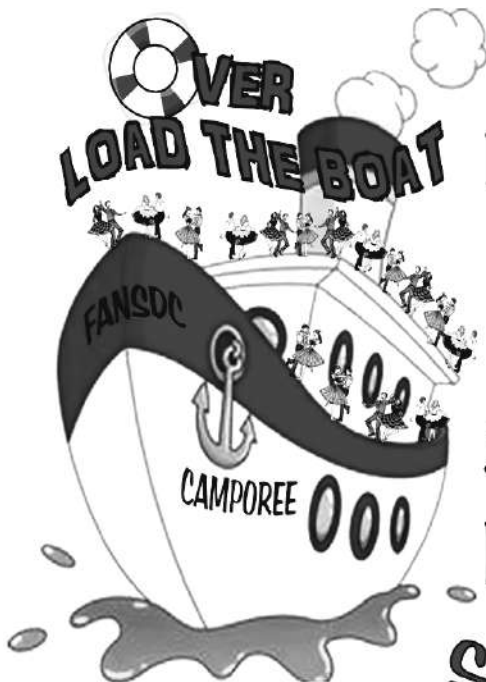
